
The Student Council visited the residents of Catherine McAuley Nursing Home for tea and chats, bringing along beautiful letters created by our talented first-year students.








Our TYs took part in SciFest this term where they displayed their projects to students and to siting judges. The students worked hard on their projects all term came up with interesting and




Events that took place..

The CDETB very kindly supplied the tutors the classes and fingers crossed they will continue into the new year.








HSCL also ran some collaborative Social events


- Coffee morning for the first year Parents to meet and greet one another in August- first day of school.


Badminton






